CLIMATE CHANGE IS HEATING UP

The Amazon Rainforest is also referred to as the lungs of the Earth and contains an estimated 390 billion individual trees divided into 16,000 species. These trees together make up roughly 6~9% or more of the world's oxygen supply. Sadly though, the Amazon Rainforest is on fire. This has been going on since August and is still going on. Trees also provide habitats like forests which are important for many species, but we are cutting down trees so it's contributing to global warming and habitat loss.

Sea turtles rely on nesting beaches to lay their eggs, many of which are threatened by rising sea levels. Did you know that the temperature of nests determines whether the eggs are male or female? Unfortunately, with temperatures on the rise, this could mean that many more females are born than males. Crocodiles are like this as well. Think about it. If there are more females than males that would affect the crocodile population, which would increase the prey population. This would disrupt the

food chain and ecosystem. Raising the temperature

also means that the ice caps are melting. It further destroys habitats for arctic animals like polar bears that live on the ice. Rising sea levels also can lead to floods in coastal cities like Osaka. This can be a massive problem because water can easily flood the city. Liquid like water can go through small cracks or openings so building a wall would be hard, even for Trump.

Things you can do to help can be small changes in your house that can make a difference. Try to use energy-saving light bulbs, walk or cycle instead of using a car, turn off electrical devices when you're not using them, recycle, and use less plastic. Do your part to help protect Earth.

She is a 16-year-old girl that spoke at the United Nations and is trying to spread awareness to the world about this issue.
